- 3. Share a time when you were so concerned for God's name (reputation) that you had to do something. What did you do?
- 4. David's passion for God's glory drove him to fight Goliath. What does your passion drive you to do?
- 5. When you face a problem or difficulty (a Giant) do you think about how God might be glorified in the situation or do you mainly focus on just getting out?
- 6. In what ways does your life demonstrate that you are confident in God's power? In what ways does your life demonstrate you are not confident in God's power? What needs to take place so you can be confident in God's power?
